FACILITATOR PROFILE



Her Ladyship Justice Sedinam Awo Kwadam (Mrs.) is a Justice of the High Court of the Republic of Ghana, renowned for her analytical excellence, sound judicial reasoning, and unwavering commitment to fairness and the rule of law. With more than 13 years of cumulative legal experience, including over a decade on the bench, she has served with distinction as a Magistrate, a Circuit Court Judge, and now as a Justice of the High Court.

A distinguished academic and educator, Justice Kwadam serves as an Adjunct Lecturer in International Criminal Law and Justice at the Ghana Institute of Management and Public Administration (GIMPA), where she helps shape the next generation of legal minds. Her own academic record is exceptional; she is the first-ever LL.M student to be awarded Valedictorian at GIMPA, graduating with the highest LL.M Grade Point Average in the institution's history (3.98/4.00).



Her academic prowess was further recognized with the Best Graduate Student Award, the Dean's Excellence Award, and the prestigious Fatou Bensouda Prize for International Criminal Law and Justice. Earlier in her legal training, she distinguished herself at the Ghana School of Law as the Best Student in Law of Evidence at her Call to the Bar in 2012.

A prolific and impactful scholar, Justice Kwadam has authored numerous legal articles and papers addressing critical issues such as procedural reform, judicial accountability, constitutional interpretation, sexual offences legislation, and Ghana's engagement with international criminal justice. Her scholarship contributes meaningfully to ongoing discourse on law reform and the development of jurisprudence in Ghana and beyond.

She is a sought-after speaker and has delivered keynote addresses, including at the Federation of African Law Students conference at the African Union Headquarters in Addis Ababa, and expert lectures at institutions such as UPSA Law School and Smith College in the USA. Her global perspective has been enriched by professional visits to leading international legal institutions, including the International Criminal Court, the International Court of Justice, and the Permanent Court of Arbitration, as well as her participation in the International Criminal Law Summer School at Utrecht University.

Justice Kwadam remains passionately dedicated to mentoring future lawyers and judges, and to promoting a modern, accessible, and equitable justice system in Ghana.

Her Honour Nana Adwoa Serwaa Dua-Adonteng is a judge, seasoned legal professional licensed by the General Legal Council of Ghana, with a Bachelor of Laws degree from Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology and extensive legal experience in corporate, commercial, and litigation law.

Her career spans significant roles including Head of Legal Department at LMI Holdings Limited, Legal Manager at Total Petroleum Ghana Limited, where she honed skills in legal advisory, contract negotiation, dispute resolution, and corporate governance. She also worked as Off-Counsel for Alexander & Partner Rechtsanwälte mbB, an international law firm, acting as its Ghanaian representative advising European clients in Ghana.



She is also a Legal Systems law lecturer at Presbyterian University, Kumasi and a Mentor for the the Chief Justice's Orange Girls' Justice Club where she mentors young girls, particularly hawkers (popularly known as kayayie) on the basic rudiments of law, etiquette, ethics, environmental protection and leadership.

She is dedicated to nurturing the next generation of legal practitioners by imparting practical knowledge, fostering critical thinking, and guiding young lawyers through the complexities of legal practice.
